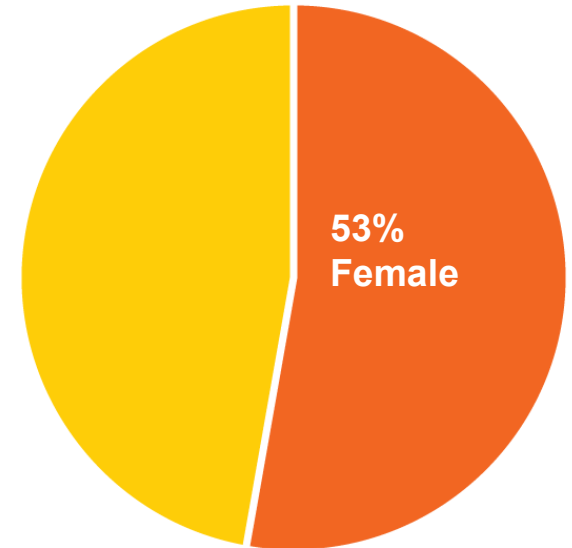
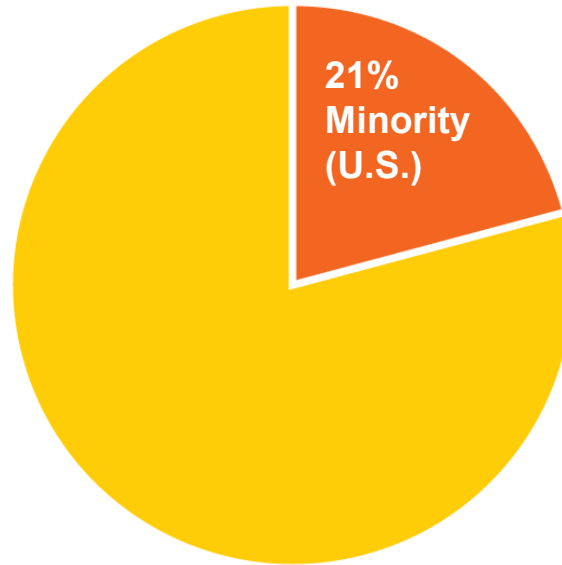
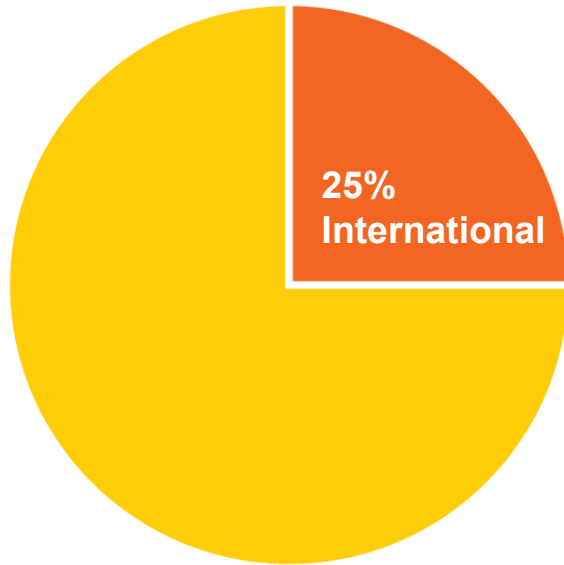

Crandall Fellowship

Overview of Crandall Fellowship


- ✓ Supports a master's candidate for up to two years (three years MFA)
- ✓ Provides a stipend of \$20,000, currently distributed over 10 monthly payments
- ✓ Can be stacked with other fellowships and is often stacked with department Graduate Assistantships (GA / RA / TA)
- ✓ Must maintain a GPA of 3.5



Who Can Apply

If you have **submitted** your online application to a **full-time master's program** at the University of Connecticut for a **Fall entry term**, you are eligible to request consideration for these fellowships.



How to Apply

1. Submit Your Application.

Submitted applications must also fulfill the application fee requirement.

2. Open your Application Status Page.

Log in via connect.grad.uconn.edu/apply/.

3. Navigate to the Accounts & Forms area.

This is the second page/tab on your Application Status Page.

4. Click on the link for the Master's Fellowships.

If you do not see the link, it is possible you cannot apply for the fellowship due to the term or program you are pursuing.

Who Needs to Write a Diversity Statement

Nominees for the **Crandall Fellowship** are expected to demonstrate *a commitment to enhancing diversity* either within their field of study or more generally in all areas of higher education.

Applicants to the Crandall Fellowship must provide a Diversity Statement upon submitting their request for consideration.

Writing Your Diversity Statement

Your Diversity Statement

Demonstrate your commitment by highlighting your participation in organizations or activities that:

- (a) directly relate to increasing access to higher education and retention in higher education of individuals, regardless of age, race, sexual orientation, gender, nationality, cultural background, religion, or beliefs or
- (b) that help to ensure that individuals are welcomed and included in higher education environments regardless of age, race, sexual orientation, gender, nationality, cultural background, religion, or beliefs.

Writing Your Diversity Statement

Such organization and activities might include:

- participation/affiliation with TRIO programs,
- cultural or affinity groups
- organizations or centers
- volunteer experiences
- college or university committees focused on these goals

Uploading Your Diversity Statement

After selecting the Crandall Fellowship on the Request for Consideration Form, you will be shown the essay prompt and be given the ability to Choose your File to upload your essay.

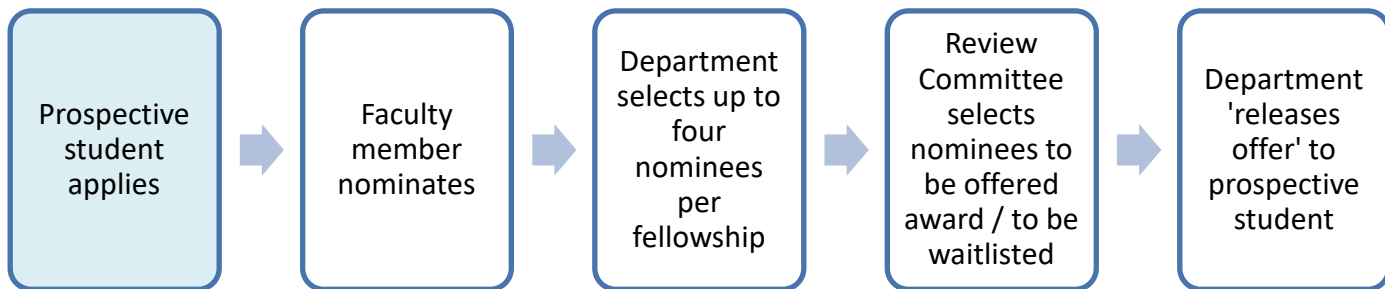

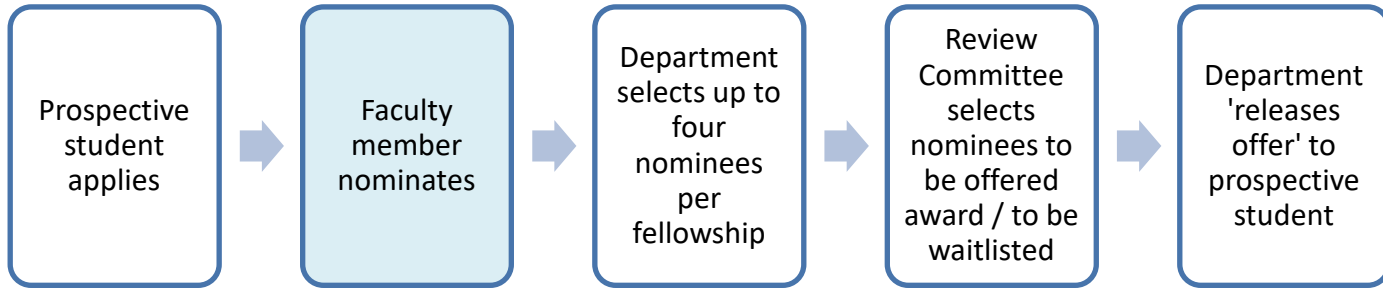


You must submit your Fall 2021 application and fellowship consideration request by **Monday 1st March 2021** before **11:59pm (EST)**.



However, if your program's application deadline is prior Monday 1st March, we strongly advise you also submit your fellowship consideration request at that time.

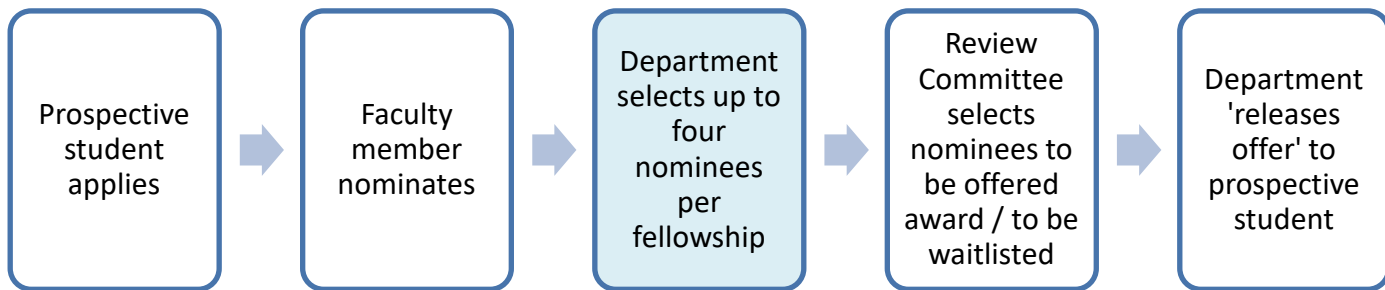
Timeline



Faculty members can view your request for fellowship consideration once your application has been reviewed by The Graduate School for English proficiency requirements and submission of unofficial transcripts.

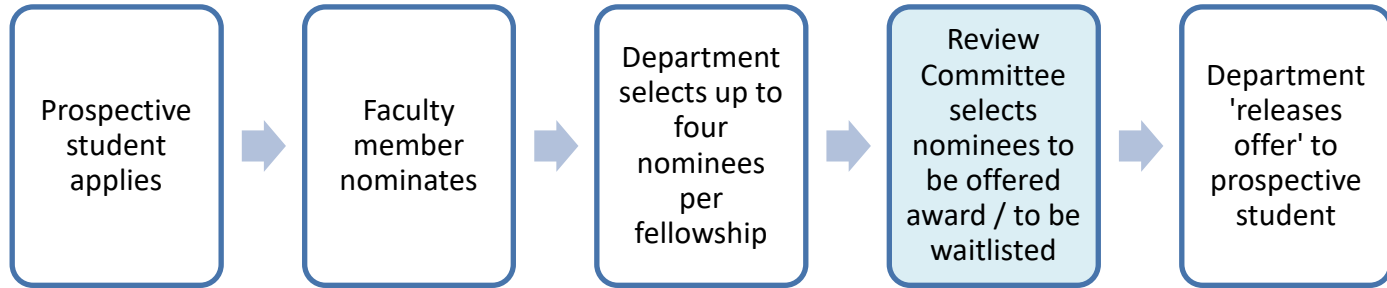
Faculty members review candidates and submit nominations.

Timeline



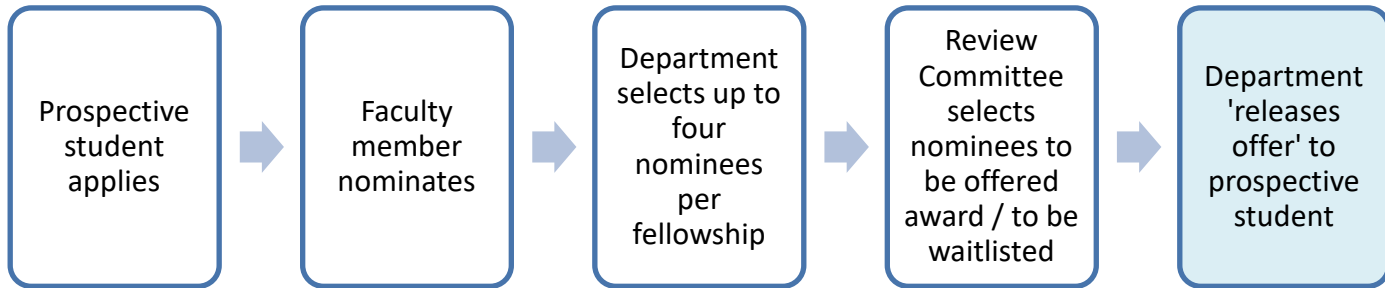
Of those applicants nominated by a faculty member, Departments then select up to four candidates to nominate for the fellowship.

Timeline



A University-wide committee reviews and selects candidates in late **March**.

Timeline



Departments will contact successful nominees in **March**.

Waitlisted nominations will likely hear in **April** if a fellowship award has become available.
